During the first half of the year you had fun gathering information on a variety of topics and subjects for the NFL club. For those that made it into our class hall of fame—congrats! Now, here is another fun (optional but HIGHLY encouraged) project that you can participate in. Those students that complete all requirements will be asked back to the class 20th Century VIP Red Carpet Affair. You WON'T want to miss this event! Here is what you need to do to qualify for the VIP Golden Ticket that will give you VIP access to the 20th Century VIP Red Carpet Affair.

TIER ONE: Remember and Understanding

Attached is a picture of a variety of major events or individuals that were featured in the 20th Century newsstands. The first thing you need to do is choose TEN events/individuals from the attached picture to learn more about.

For each picture chosen you need to gather basic information. Here are some questions to guide you. You must have **THREE** questions answered for each of your chosen pictures.

Here is a list of questions you may answer...

| Event Questions | Individual Questions |

Tier Two: Applying and Analyzing

Once you have gathered basic information on 10 events/individuals you now have to select **TWO** from the choices you already researched. You should select two that you feel really interests you and you want to *learn* more about. Since our theme for this year is "CHANGE" make sure to include aspects of change in your research. You should pick at least **two** questions below to answer. Here is a list of questions you may use to help you gather more information...

TIER TWO AND THREE GUIDELINES

Below are a list of ways you can organize and present your information for TIERS TWO and THREE. You cannot do an option below more than once. Make sure to incorporate the required questions you pick into your final work. Feel free to tweak and adapt each idea to fit **your** creativity!!

| Be a Star (Body Smart) | Be a Song Writer (Music Smart) |

| Write a short play on one part of the individuals life and then act in it | Choose some songs that you feel relate to the event/individual and use those songs to help you tell the story |
